Stand to Reason Tactics—"Taking the Roof Off"

The Stand to Reason series begins by encouraging all Christians to engage in calm, rational, and gentle debate with persons who do not believe in God. Or, they could be persons who make statements that are inconsistent with a Christian world view. The author teaches the Colombo Tactic in the first session. He teaches Christians not to attack the false statement, but simply to ask the Colombo question: "How did you come to that conclusion?" This beginning is non-confrontational and can easily lead to a positive and constructive conversation.

In Session 5 of the Tactics course, which we enjoyed on March 11, Mr. Koukl taught and demonstrated a tactic called "Taking the Roof Off". In this case, he teaches Christians to draw attention to statements

CRWRF Disaster Relief Re: Cyclone Idai & Papua Flooding

This year has begun with storms of epic proportions causing damage, loss, and disease. CRWRF is actively working with our trusted partners to help those that have been affected by these storms.

CRWRF will partner with World Renew to help those that have been affected by Cyclone Idai which is being described as one of the worst storms to hit southern Africa. Monies donated will go towards food baskets, blankets, temporary shelters and seeds to replant crops that were destroyed. For this project, all eligible Canadian donations will be matched up to 4x by the Canadian Foodgrains Bank.

CRWRF has also responded to another disaster in Indonesia, this time in the area of Sentani, Jayapura, Papua. A flash flood destroyed homes, schools, churches, bridges, and markets, killed over a hundred people and forced more than 10,000 people out of their homes. Funds raised for this cause will go towards food, health & hygiene care packages.

Donation for this relief effort will be gratefully accepted. They should be earmarked either Cyclone Idai (Africa) – Disaster Relief 2019 or Flooding in Papua – Disaster Relief 2019. of opinion that are quite simply illogical or irrational. When there are illogical contradictions in an expressed point of view, we need to ask questions to bring the person making those statements to a position of clarity. Someone might argue: "Homosexual behaviour is morally permissible because some people are born with natural tendencies toward homosexuality." Rather than attack that opinion statement directly, the author encourages listeners to ask questions that will "Take the Roof off" and illustrate the problems with the point of view. For example, one could ask, "Are all 'natural' human tendencies morally permissible?" What if a person claims to have a natural tendency to steal? What if a person claims to be "naturally" attracted to children? With these questions, the inconsistencies in the opinion statement become clear, and seeds of doubt are planted.

In another common example, we hear statements from people who are content to be moral relativists. They might say: "I do not believe in absolute morality. I believe every person should be free to decide on their own morals." Does that sound okay? Some might even be tempted to agree. But, then you might also "take the roof off" this argument. You can ask: Is your dismissal of absolute morality a moral absolute for you? If so, isn't that illogical? Is your freedom to choose an absolute moral? What if someone steals your car? Wouldn't you call that immoral?

In a third example, some people express partial opposition to abortion. They might say, "I am personally against abortion, but I do not believe in forcing my point of view on others." Again, that sounds a bit like being a good neighbour. But then you could ask questions and take the roof off that one too!

You can ask: "So you believe that killing a pre-born baby is wrong, but only for yourself? You will allow anyone else to do it without restrictions?" "If you just let your neighbour do it without any restrictions, is that still morally okay for you?" Is that the kind of society you want to live in? The tactic is quite clear. Take the other point of view to the extreme. Test it out and point out that the opinion leads to an absurd final position. That proves that it cannot be a valid starting point. Finally, Mr. Koukl stressed that we always need to be friendly, gentle, and respectful in pointing to the truth of God's Word. Always be persuasive. Never be antagonistic.

These are just a few examples of "Taking the Roof Off"! We hope you are intrigued and interested enough to attend the final session of the Stand to Reason series. See you there on Monday evening at 8:00 p.m.
