Short Report of the Council Meeting July 15, 2019

1. The chairman, Henry Voorhorst, opened the meeting with the reading of Revelations 12 and prayer. All members of council were in attendance. A special welcome was extended to Br. Jeremy Segstro.
2. The chairman gave a summary of the demographic makeup of the congregation and the congregational activities that members are involved in. Br. Segstro asked a number of questions which were

discussed. The letter of call was also discussed.

3. Br. Segstro informed consistory that he was willing to give a response to the call by July 28. If the call is accepted, he confirmed that he was hoping to move to Cloverdale in August.

4. Question period was held.

5. Br. Aren VanDyke closed the Council portion of the meeting with prayer.

Short Report of the Consistory Meeting July 15, 2019

1. The meeting was continued from the previous council meeting.

2. The current wards were reviewed to give Br. Segstro a sense of the congregation.

3. The structure of catechism classes was reviewed.

4. Consistory decided to ask Langley CanRC as the convening church of the next Classis Pacific West to delay the next classis until October 1, 2019 to allow Candidate Segstro time to prepare for a potential peremptory examination.

4. The short report was approved via email.
