As many of you are aware, Team Alabanza is set to head down to Pan de Vida orphanage in Queretaro, Mexico. We plan to leave D.V July 5, 2019 and return July 19, 2019.

We would like to thank you for all your support thus far. It is greatly appreciated and we are so blessed to be a part of this community. With thankfulness to God we were able to exceed our financial goal needed to purchase supplies for the work we will be doing as well as taking the children out for a couple of day activities.

We are currently seeking donations that have been requested by the directors of the orphanage. Pan de Vida relies on the donations of teams and the community to ensure the children have the proper clothes they need as well as supplies for school and church.

Anything donated is greatly appreciated. We do, however, have a list as follows with the more specific requests from Pan de Vida:

- Twin size bedsheets (for both the girls and boys)

- Adult toothbrushes

- Socks (boys and girls ages 4 to 14)
